

Rules and Regulations

Registration will be from 4:00 - 6:00 p.m. Saturday, September 18. **For special consideration contact Kathy Walton at 717-243-8750 or kaw1127@aol.com before September 11, 2021.**

Open to any youth who meets the age requirements. Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Divisions. Previous Senior Division first place winners are not eligible to compete another time.

Age as of show day:

- Junior: Age 8-11
- Intermediate: Age 12-15
- Senior: Age 16-21

Showmanship classes will be run in heats if the number of participants warrants. Heats will be judged with the top showmen returning for the final class. The judge will be instructed to bring back as many good showmen in each heat as he wishes for further competition. The top ten places in each age division will be recognized. There will be no reasons given by the judges.

Participants must provide their own show harness. A white uniform is preferred. Participants must secure the animal that they will use in the showmanship portion of the contest. The animal does not have to be their own, however they must designate the breed at registration and use the same animal throughout the competition. Youth who bring their own animals, but who do not wish to compete in any other contest, do not need to enter any show, but must call to reserve stalls by Saturday, September 4, 2021. A stall fee

will apply. Milking females DO NOT have to be “bagged” for competition. Extra credit will not be given to those who are. No bulls are permitted. It is the responsibility of the contestant to be at ringside on time. The first heat will begin at 8:30 am. Subsequent heats will begin not less than 20 minutes after that. (i.e. 8:50, 9:10, 9:30 etc.) However, they may take longer than 20 minutes, so contestants should be aware of how the show is progressing.

Only the top ten Senior Division showmanship participants will advance to the fitting competition. The fitting judge will observe the final round of the showmanship contest and the showmanship judge will observe the fitting competition. The fitting phase will begin at 1:30 p.m. in the Large Arena. The ten finalists must report to the Large Arena with their equipment by 1:15 p.m.

Each Senior participant will be assigned by random drawing to a heifer. They will have 1 (one) hour to work, fitting the heifer. Each contestant may have one helper (aged 16-21). The helper is to block the animal and hold the head up. There will be NO brushing, clipping, spraying, coaching, advising, etc. by the helper. There will also be NO interaction between contestants and the ringside or other contestants. At the end of the hour, a judge will evaluate the performance of the participants. The showmanship judge and the fitting judge will confer to make a final decision.

Winners will be announced and recognized immediately after the fitting phase.

The PDCA Showmanship Evaluation Card is used as the judging standard for all divisions. Resources describing Showmanship skills and techniques are available from many resources. Please review them prior to attending the contest. Showmanship at this level is extremely competitive, so come prepared.

Prizes and sponsors are listed in the AADS Showmanship Booklet available the day of the contest.

Interpretation of the rules will be by the committee whose decision will be final.

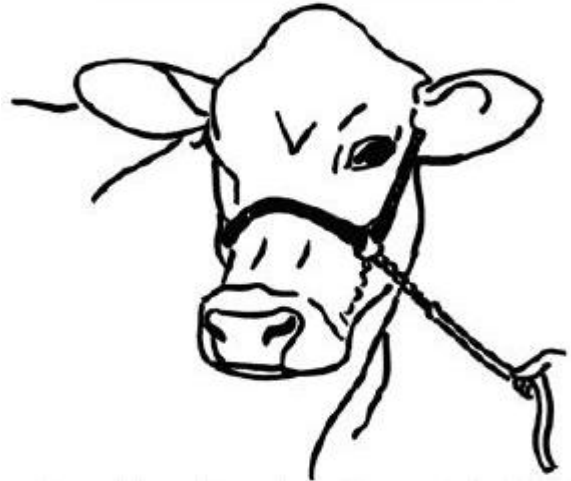
