DEFINITIONS & SPECIAL RULES

A: EXHIBITOR DEFINED: The exhibitor must be the owner. In case a herd is registered or bred in the names of different members of a family, residing on one farm or breeding establishment, and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for all group classes. However, members of one family, where cattle are not housed as one unit, will not be considered as a single exhibitor.

B: OWNERSHIP: To be eligible for competition, whether single or in groups, animals must be entered exactly as ownership appears on the registration certificate. The registration certificate showing the most recent date of activity will be considered official. Sale animal ownership will be that of the consignor. Registration certificates showing ownership must be available.

Animals owned in partnership may be shown in the name of the partnership only, except for "Family Unit" as defined above, under EXHIBITOR DEFINED. For example, if Exhibitor A and Exhibitor B own an animal in partnership and each owns animals individually, three (3) separate exhibitors exist.

1 – for Exhibitor A; 1 – for Exhibitor B and 1 – For Exhibitor A & B Partnership

OWNER DEFINED: To qualify for Bred & Owned Awards, one of the original owners must be listed as one of the current owners.

A. For an exhibitor to be eligible to show an animal, the title of ownership by the exhibitor shall show on the Certificate of Registry at the time of the exhibition.

B. Animals eligible to be shown at a National Brown Swiss show will have one of the following registration certificates. Standard Registration Certificate which is white with a green border is issued for Registered Brown Swiss Females and Certified Identity Enrolled Females (CIE). Brown Swiss Step II Identity Enrollment (IE) animals which have a green registration paper with black border may also be shown. Animals with other colored paper may not be shown.

**** The Pennsylvania Brown Swiss Breeders Association will award the prize money to the Brown Swiss Two Year Old Futurity*

As outlined in the PDCA Show ring Code of Ethics, if a National Show judge should bring to the attention of the Brown Swiss Association staff possible unethical practices related to Brown Swiss cattle exhibited at a National Show, Brown Swiss Association staff will consult with Show Management as to the proper steps to be taken.

Any animal sold or exhibited as registered by the Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders Association can be Genomic/DNA typed at the discretion of the Executive Secretary. All expenses to be paid by Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders Association.

NATIONAL BROWN SWISS ASSOCIATION AWARDS

Production Awards – Special breed production ribbons will be awarded based on highest 305d ECM record. Current record may be included if the latest official test sheet is provided by the exhibitor. The test sheet must be sent to and received by the National Brown Swiss office at least two weeks prior to show day. Records received after that will be accepted only with a \$50 late fee. The winner must stand in the top seventy-five percent of the class (top five if fewer than 10 in class). These are awarded in the Senior 2-Year Old, as well as the Junior & Senior 3-Year Old, 4-Year Old, and 5-Year Old, Aged, and Component Merit Cow classes.

SPECIAL AWARDS

Vid Vye Memorial Trophy – A serving tray (replica of the one kept in the National Office) presented to the owner of the Grand Champion Female at each National Brown Swiss Show.

Type and Production - Trophy to be awarded at each National Show to the exhibitor of the cow with the highest ECM. The cow must stand in the top five if fewer than 20 in class or top 20% if more than 20 in class. The official DHI record must be provided by the owner.

Fred S. Idtse Recognition Trophy – The State Herd winner at each National Show will be recognized by having its name placed on a plaque located at the National Office.

Ira Inman Trophy – Awarded annually to the Premier Breeder at each National Brown Swiss Show. A replica of the original trophy, which is kept at the National Office, is given to each winner.

PREMIER NATIONAL JUNIOR BROWN SWISS SHOW

Eligibility: For an animal to be exhibited as junior owned, in all classes, the recorded ownership must show in the sole ownership of the exhibitor or partnership composed of Brown Swiss Association Junior Members. (Adult-Junior partnerships and family farm partnerships are not acceptable). Junior members for the National Brown Swiss Association are between the ages of 9 and 21 and must be a Junior member by August 1 of the current show season. Exhibitors must not have reached the 22nd birthday by January 1 in the competing year. Members who become 21 years of age during the current year are allowed to compete. All transfers and recorded ownerships must be dated by August 1 of the current show year for all classes. If joint ownership, one of the owners must be declared the exhibitor during check-in. Awards will be presented as one unit, to all owners equally. Animals that are leased through the National Brown Swiss Association Lease Program are also eligible to be shown as juniors. The leased animal's recorded owner will receive open show awards.

To compete for production awards, the production records must be submitted to the national office at least two weeks prior to show date.

Each junior will receive a shirt to wear when showing in the junior show.

Showing: In junior shows, the junior member who owns the animal is to show her. If the owner cannot attend the show, another National Brown Swiss Association junior member may show the animal. Also, in a class where a junior member owns more than one animal, another National Brown Swiss Association junior member may show the second animal. An alternate leadsperson form must be submitted.

If for some reason the junior is having trouble showing the animal, another junior may assist but the junior owner must continue to accompany the animal.

Junior Show Production awards are based on the highest 305d ECM record and are provided to junior-owned animals in the Senior 2-Year Old, as well as the Junior & Senior 3-, 4-, and 5-Year Old, Aged, and Component Merit Cow classes. The award goes to the cow with the highest 305d ECM record. Animal must place in the top 75% of the class.

A Junior and Reserve Junior Champion, Senior and Reserve Senior Champion, and Grand and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected at all National Junior Shows. The procedure for selection, whether or not to ask the second-place animals to return to the ring, will be left to Show Management.

If the show is split between two days, Junior Champion of the Junior Show may be selected on the day that the heifer classes are shown.

Senior and Grand Champion and Reserves are selected immediately following the cow classes.

PREMIER NATIONAL JUNIOR BROWN SWISS SHOW SPECIAL AWARDS

A special rosette will be given to Junior Champion and Reserve, Intermediate Champion and Reserve, Senior Champion and Reserve, and Grand Champion and Reserve. Each class winner will receive an award. Juniors also receive production awards based on the highest 305d ECM record. Production records must be sent to and received by the National Brown Swiss office two weeks prior to show day. These awards are provided for a junior-owned animal in each of the following classes: Junior & Senior 3-, 4-, and 5-Year Old, Aged, and Component Merit Cow. Shirts will be provided to each junior before the show and must be worn by the junior during the show. There will be no cash awards from the National Brown Swiss Association.

The first-place entry in each class and champions will receive an award donated by Brown Swiss Breeders and Supporters.
