NATIONAL SHOW

SPECIAL RULES – If a violation of the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association Code Of Ethics is established, the exhibitor, employee, and/or animal can be disbarred from exhibiting and will forfeit premiums and awards for a period of up to three years in accordance with the rules adopted by the American Guernsey Association.

For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in a National Guernsey Show, each participant by virtue of having voluntarily made an appropriate entry into such a show or activity thereby releases the American Guernsey Association, its officers, directors, and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgements past, present, or future, arising from or connected with the administration of such show or activity and the resulting decisions there from.

UNIFORM DRESS CODE – All Guernsey exhibitors are required to wear white trousers or white skirts and to use an official number harness when leading animals in the ring. Violators will not be permitted to enter the ring.

BEST UDDERED COW – The first-place udder cow in each of the milking classes will compete following the Grand Champion Female class to select the BEST UDDERED COW.

BEST THREE FEMALES – Group to consist of three females bred by exhibitor, all or in part, two milking animals and one any age. At least two must be owned by the exhibitor.

PRODUCTION RECOGNITION – Production recognition for pounds of milk, butterfat, and protein will be given in the Junior and Senior 3 year old, 4 year old, 5 year old, and aged cow classes. This recognition will be based on the most recent 305-day, or less, actual production records. These records may be DHIR, DHI, or AM/PM. The exhibitor may provide recent test sheets, otherwise the AGA will assess awards based on lactations on file.

PERFORMANCE REGISTER – The first five winners in each of the individual classes and the show champions will be recorded in the performance files of the American Guernsey Association and appear on future official performance pedigrees issued by the AGA.

NATIONAL GUERNSEY SHOW SPECIAL AWARDS

THE AMERICAN GUERNSEY ASSOCIATION TROPHY, awarded to the first-place Junior 2 Year Old Cow and to the first-place Senior 2 Year Old Cow by the American Guernsey Association.

TOTAL PERFORMANCE COW AWARD, a plaque in honor of Lee Yost, Benton, Pennsylvania, to be presented by the Pennsylvania Guernsey Breeders Association.

THE CARROLL EBY TROPHY, awarded annually by Wayne and Charles McLaughlin in memory of Carroll Eby, to the exhibitor of the first-place aged cow.

THE DOUGLSTON MANOR FARM TROPHY, awarded annually in honor of Douglaston Manor Farm, Pulaski, New York, to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Female.

THE BURTON LANE FARM TROPHY, awarded annually in honor of Burton Lane Farm, Lake Forest, Illinois, to the exhibitor of the Reserve Grand Champion Female.

THE DONALD T. BURTON TROPHY, a memorial plaque awarded annually by the family and friends of Donald T. Burton, Eagle, Wisconsin, to the Best Female Bred & Owned by the Exhibitor.

THE MEADOW LODGE FARMS TROPHY, awarded in honor of Judge Samuel B. Hayes of Oklahoma, to the exhibitor of the Best Uddered Female.

THE BILL JONES TROPHY, awarded annually by the New York Guernsey Breeders Cooperative, to the exhibitor of the first-place Best Three Females.

THE PEER CHALLENGE TROPHY, awarded in honor of Frank S. Peer, Ithaca, New York, to the owner of the first-place Exhibitor's Herd.

THE GORDON HALL MEMORIAL TROPHIES, awarded in Honor of Gordon Hall, to the Premier Breeder and to the Premier Exhibitor of the show.

GUERNSEY PERPETUAL CHALLENGE TROPHY, presented by the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of Guernsey, to the breeder of the Grand Champion Female.

The official DHIA record must be provided by the owner with substantiating evidence (the official DHIA record report form or a statement giving the record, signed by the official DHI supervisor) when the entries are checked by the Guernsey Staff. In case of a tie, the contending records will be converted to an ECM

(Energy Corrected Milk) basis with high record being the winner.

AFTON FARM PERPETUAL TROPHY, Grand Champion Female, awarded in honor of Afton Farm, Florham Park, New Jersey.

JUNIOR & GRAND CHAMPION, The Pennsylvania Guernsey Breeders Association will award a trophy to these winners.

JUNIOR TOTAL PERFORMANCE COW AWARD, a banner to be presented by the American Guernsey Association.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Any boy or girl who meets the following qualifications is eligible to participate.
 - (a.) Open to any AGA Junior Member who has not reached their 21st birthday by January 1st of the current year and are over the age of eight on that date.
 - (b.) The participant must be the recorded owner of one or more registered Guernsey females, properly recorded in the Herd Register of the American Guernsey Association, or respective National Guernsey Association or a participant in the American Guernsey Association Youth Lease Agreement Program and must be a Junior Member of AGA.
 - (c.) The qualifying record of ownership or lease for animals, other than those bred by the junior exhibitor, shall be determined by the actual date the application for transfer of ownership was received in the office of The American Guernsey Association. This date is automatically stamped on the back of the registration certificate and will be found with the transfer of ownership data. The date of the receipts stamped on the registration certificate must be prior to August 1.
 - (d.) In all classes the record ownership must show in the sole ownership of the exhibitor or partnership comprised of AGA Junior Members or be a participant in the American Guernsey Association Youth Lease Program.
 - (e.) Best Animal Bred and Owned By Exhibitor-Registration papers will be checked in the ring to verify that the individual Junior Exhibitor is the breeder.
 - (f.) If the participant is exhibiting under the American Guernsey Association Youth Lease Agreement Program, all guidelines and terms must have been followed and a copy of the signed and dated agreement must be present and the animal must be led by the lessee. FREQUENCY PARTICIPATION

2. Any boy or girl who meets eligibility to participate may exhibit in as many years as his or her eligibility will permit.

ENTRIES EXHIBITED

3. (a.) Each junior exhibitor is limited to a maximum of two entries per class but is eligible to show in each class.
(b.) There is no limitation on the number of times an eligible animal may be exhibited.
4. (a.) Exhibitors are required to show their own animals except a substitute showman (who is the same age or younger) may be used in case the owner, for some justifiable reason, is unable to attend the show. While in the ring, at the discretion of Show Management, a youth may be assisted or replaced by another youth exhibitor, if required. Adults are not allowed to show in any case or assist with the State Herd Class. A substitute leadsperson may only be used at one National Junior Show per year.
(b.) All exhibitors will be required to wear white clothes and an official National Junior Show Shirt while exhibiting their animals. Shirts or other items of clothing with a farm name will not be allowed.

5. (a.) There is no limit on the number of entries per state.

(b.) Entries are to be made on entry forms available from the Show Manager for both the PREMIER National Junior Guernsey Show and the Open National Guernsey Show. All entries, junior and open shows, will be included in the Open Show superintendent's book, if additional entry fee is paid. Those animals to be entered in the Junior Show MUST BE SO MARKED ON THE ENTRY BLANK. If not designated as Junior Show entries, they will not be included in the Junior Show list of entries. Animals entered in both the Junior Show and the Open Show will be assigned one ring number and the number will apply in both shows.

(c.) Entries are to be sent directly to the All-American Dairy Show. Show Management will forward copies of the entries to the American Guernsey Association to confirm eligibility.
